Information about the local health and social care system

- 6. Matters noted during the period are as follows:
 - Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) is rated Inadequate and as a result is now under Directions from NHS England. The CCG is unlikely to meet the £3m planned deficit but end the year with a £15m deficit position. The cause of this overspend is significant demand for acute hospital services and under-delivery of in year annual savings plans (Quality Innovation Productivity and Prevention plans). This is stated to be addressed through joint work with hospitals, with primary care and with local authorities. By reducing acute hospital activity, the CCG would like to invest in general practice and community services. This investment is crucial to the recovery of the health system.
 - Local Executive Partnership Boards are proposed to include local
 authority and other stakeholders to help develop partnership working.
 The CCG values the excellent patient engagement through existing
 locality groups and intends to support this going forward. The CCG is
 proposing to suspend the formal Local Commissioning Boards to free up
 managerial resource to focus on financial recovery, supporting general
 practice and freeing up the clinical resource to spend more time on
 service redesign.
 - The CCG has begun an engagement process on minor injury services and the need for change in East Cambridgeshire and Fenland. A second and third wave of meetings are now open to the public, see http://www.cambridgeshireandpeterboroughccg.nhs.uk/News-and-events
 - Information on the Sustainability and Transformation Programme Fit for the Future is published following approval of the draft local plan
 by NHS England and NHS Improvement. See

 - Hinchingbrooke Healthcare NHS Trust received an overall Good rating in August from the Care Quality Commission following inspection in May. Urgent and emergency services was the only area identified as Requiring Improvement.
 - Hinchingbrooke Healthcare NHS Trust and the Peterborough & Stamford Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust have produced a full business case for merger for each Trust to consider on 27th and 29th September respectively. Engagement with the public has been stepped up in recent months. Decisions on public consultation are dependent on the outcome of the Board meetings.

- A public consultation on devolution of decisions on spending for public services including housing, transport, further education and health and social care integration was held during August. Devolution would depend on a directly elected mayor working across the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough areas.
- Cambridgeshire Health and Wellbeing Board membership now includes CCG and Health Service provider organisation leaders with District and County elected members. - The collapse of the Uniting Care Partnership for older people's and adult community services is being reviewed by Parliament's Public Accounts Committee during September.
