	Siobhan MacBean, SEND Cambridgeshire County Council, said they are setting up an Adulthood Steering Group for Cambridgeshire.
	They have appointed a new Preparing for Adulthood Lead in Cambridgeshire called Martine Simpson Thomas.

Some key areas they are working on are Health, employment and places to live. As well as improving their information is available and updated on their website.

Neil shared he spoke with young people to find out what work they would like to do? And he found out that some would like to work with animals be a footballer Manager or work in music.

Q Can Martine Simpson Thomas join the Board meeting?

Gareth asked should we invite her to the group to meet everyone first and give an update on adulthood?

The Board agreed.

Gareth from LDP talked about recruitment is very difficult at the moment in Health and Social Care. They are interviewing a new psychologist lead and trying to encourage people to become apprentices.

They have a new psychiatrist joining the Hunts Team in September.

The Clinical Commissioning Group are funding counselling for people with learning difficulties and their carers who are suffering anxiety and depression. People will be able to have up to 8 sessions in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough.

This is a pilot project for 18 months. If it is successful the project will become permanent.

Q What about adults with Autism?
A They might be able to offer something in the future.

Q How do we access that help? A The Operational Team, Gareth's Team, Tina's Team will work out who will benefit best from this. It is only a pilot scheme so there is limited funding.

6.		Adult Learning Disability Respite review
	FIA	A review is where we look at something - a document, policy, service.
	11	Toni Bawden, a commissioner, is reviewing respite care and has recently sent out surveys and speaking to people who provide the services, staff and carers.
		Any Experiences on respite care please let me know and feel free to give me feedback.
		Somebody shared that they lived nearby the respite care and often see a group of staff smoking outside and doesn't give the right impression.
		Toni advised she would take that back as findings. Siobhan Macbean asked the family carer to message her privately on where that was.
		Q Wondering on what timescales for the review A Any new provision will be from November 2023 at the moment gathering a lot of data. Then the next step will be going to proposals to the board in June.
		Q The manor in Peterborough for children shut 3 years ago are you aware?
		A Toni answered that she has heard of the Manor, but she is dealing with adult respite services.
		Siobhan advised that there are 3 provisions over Cambridgeshire and Peterborough for respite for overnight short breaks for children.
		Somebody asked if they could have the survey sent to them.
		Q What does Respite mean?  A It means a break for the family carer, and it is also beneficial for the person needing to be cared for. It also

prevents crisis and relationship breakdown and hospitalisation.

Q Who do I contact for support if you are an unpaid carer and something happens to you or you need to go into hospital? What happens to your cared for?

A Gareth advised there is "A what if"plan is a contingency plan where support would come to your home and help you short term.

Amanda advised that your GP will need to know if a person has an informal carer so if an emergency situation occurred and your medical records were accessed, emergency services would automatically know you were on your own.

**Siobhan** shared that Caring Together do a what if plan and are open to any carer.

## Health Sub-group



Graham has been attending the Council's Adult Social Care Forum which has been focussing on its priorities digital inclusion, communication and co-production.

One of the priorities of this board back in 2020 was to bring back the Health Subgroup in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. We have brought it back with Graham's support.

We had one meeting since and we talked about GP Surgeries and how sometimes they can be confusing. Covid rules have made them more confusing with changes to entry/exit and if you can have someone with you.

We discussed that Health checks are not being done or if they are them then there are improvements to be done. Letters were sent out from the national Team for annual health checks.

Q: Are there Annual Health checks for people with Autism?

A: I believe that is starting now, challenge is that not all people are registered as Autistic at their GP Surgery? And that is how the health check will be offered as they have the Autistic Register.

Q Are you doing anything about GP surgeries seeing people face to face as it is very hard to get appointments?

A yes everyone I think is feeling that and GP surgeries should be offering appointments face to face when needed if people are feeling anxious talking on the phone.

Graham said that if you have difficulties with your GP surgery, you can tell him and he will let our Healthwatch colleagues know so that they can follow up.
