Updates From Other Meetings Adult Social Care Forum Had a presentation about an App being developed called 'Joy', it will allow healthcare professional to see what services and organisations are available in the local area to refer their patient directly to. The idea is that this will assist social prescribers to help link patients (with more complex/ different needs than previously have been able to help) to lots of organisations and service.
7.	My Health	Learning Disability Health Sub-Group Meeting Summary On last meeting Thursday 3 rd November 2022 discussed: Learning disability issues with annual health checks, health action plans and health screening (already covered earlier in this meeting). Had a presentation on Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm Health Screening, a service that looks at large blood vessels in the walls of which men over 65 years can have a predisposition to. Ultrasound service can pick these up which if left untreated can rupture and be fatal. The service was looking for help in reaching all men over 65, to communicate this information to encourage and higher take up of the screening service.
		Social Care want to work with carers and those with lived experience to decide how to spend this money. TB asked which organisations should they speak to across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough? Questions, Answers and Comments Michelle asked if wanted individuals rather than organisations and could we have some further information/ leaflets to send out. Toni explained everyone is welcome, but grant would only be eligible for organisations only not individuals. ACTION: Graham to pass Michelle details.
