The Learning Disability Partnership are happy the covid restrictions have lifted and was lovely to see so many people from the Speak Out Council at Orchard Park. The teams will still follow safe practice wearing Masks as high infections in Cambridgeshire.

Keen to get the day service open end of March and April as respite has been challenging in Covid.

This year they will be working very hard on a new service called "Enhanced Service" for anyone that needs

additional support outside normal hours. We have some extra funding from the CCG to pay for this.

Extra funding been given for all staff to receive training on "Trauma informed Practice".

Amanda Duffin, Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG), Said they are going to be working with GPs to encourage carrying out proper quality annual health checks. They will be employing a nurse who will visit all the GPs within Cambridgeshire and Peterborough to help with these healthchecks.

Siobhan MacBean, SEND Cambridgeshire County Council, said that they are working on a detailed action plan on children with educational needs.

The Network Team said some people with disabilities are worried about people not wearing masks since the Covid rules changed.



They have been very busy

The Speak out Council have been very busy signing up 6 new Safe Places. There is a safe places website or use an app to find out.

They have ordered safe places card when out and about and will have your phone number on and look forward to working with Thera and SEN. To get a safe place card you can email speakoutcouncil@voiceability.org or visit the website https://www.voiceability.org/

Neil met with young people from CRC and Samuel Pepys to find out what they think and they said they are bored or lonely so work has started to make a directory for the summer holidays for young people.

Young people want to work but need some support. The Speak out council want to work with employers to create a guidance to make work more accessible for young people.

They have made various short films about hospital passports and the learning disability nurses within the hospitals and just need to do some finishing touches.

All Speak out leaders have had safeguarding training refreshers and this report can be shared.

A parent/ carer shared toilets in Wisbech have been taken over by the Wisbech Town Council and are going to be staffed. The Queen Mary Centre always has a receptionist at the door and suggested there as a safe place.
